SUMMER COURSES

YEARLONG COURSES

SPRING SEMESTER COURSES

Upper School (Jr. High, High School) courses: 16 weeks, 32 classes*, classes meeting twice per week

- Orientation sessions**: week of January 15
- Start date: Monday, January 22
- End date: Friday, May 18

HOLIDAYS (NO CLASSES)

- Monday, November 20–Friday, November 24 (Thanksgiving)
- Monday, December 18–Friday, January 5 (Christmas and New Year's)
- Monday, March 26–Friday, March 30 (Holy Week/Easter)

IMPORTANT DATES

- Week of August 28: orientation sessions** for fall semester and yearlong courses
- September 5: first day of fall semester and yearlong courses
- November 20–24: Thanksgiving holiday (no classes)
- December 18–January 5: Christmas and New Year's holidays (no classes)
- Week of January 15: orientation sessions** for spring semester courses
- January 19: last day of fall semester courses
- January 22: first day of spring semester courses

- March 26–30: Holy Week/Easter holiday (no classes)
- May 18: last day of spring semester and yearlong courses

*Classes that fall on national holidays beyond the school-wide holidays noted above (e.g. Labor Day) will be cancelled or rescheduled at the instructor's discretion.
